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Ballistic Fireworks to light up Gawler

The Ballistic Fireworks team is set to light up Gawler's skies this show season with a fantastical display of colour and sparkle.

Coming from the generational family-owned business, Ballistic Fireworks manager Sean Philpot said the fiery celebration is in his blood, with the team's 45 years of experience doing firework displays professionally.

"We regularly do spectacular displays like the Gawler Show and pride ourselves in delivering some serious wow factor," he said.

Coming to the Gawler Show for the very first time, Mr Philpot said they're looking to impress the locals with the very best display of local industry.

The display is set to feature a modern upbeat soundtrack with fireworks synchronised to the beat and layered across the arena from multiple positions.

Audiences can expect lots of colour coordination and high impact chase sequences.

"[it is] sure to get people's attention," Mr Philpot said.

"[My] favourite part of doing fireworks is the look on people's faces.

"Fireworks are such a sensory experience, looking into the crowd and seeing a kid's

first fireworks display is always something special.

"Our crew also enjoys the adrenaline rush and smell of the smoke that comes with doing the display."

With a new audience to impress this year, Mr Philpot also said the team is making safety its number one priority, apart from putting a smile on someone's face.

"We have spent our whole career training in the safe use and handling of fireworks, countless hours of practice and experience means that we ensure a safe display every time," he said.

"The key to safety is distance and fireworks selection, choosing the appropriate fireworks for the arena size and weather conditions is paramount to a great display."

Ballistic Fireworks is set to wow audiences on Saturday night at 8.15pm.



Hooves, horns and hometown glory: Gawler Show unleashes its Livestock Parade

The region's biggest and best livestock will be on display with the Gawler Show Livestock Parade making its way to this year's program for the first time ever.

With a focus on cattle, goats and horses, the parade will feature the class and school winners as they walk a lap around the 'Taylor and Forgie Arena' to show their livestock.

Gawler Show president Braden Turner said the new addition to the show is something the team has been excited to announce.

"It's something new we're really looking forward to, and we hope it will organically

grow each year with more participants getting involved," he said.

"It's a fantastic opportunity to showcase the animals and the people behind them, and we're especially excited to have local schools involved.

"It's another way to bring the community together and celebrate the agricultural roots of the Show."

For Mr Turner, the parade is a chance for the community to celebrate the best parts of rural living.

"[The parade] serves a bit of a reminder that

even with the ever-increasing urban sprawl our roots run back to our farming communities and the livestock that runs across our land," he said.

"Livestock Parades are a massive part of most shows, in our instance it's an opportunity for our prize winners to show off their livestock as well as an opportunity for our school groups to gain some more experience handling their livestock and showing them."

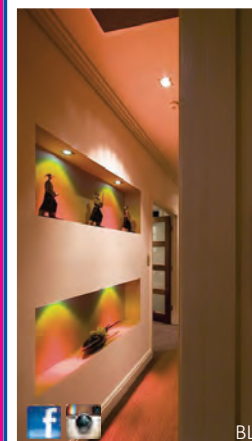

When he's not helping to organise or run the annual tradition, Mr Turner can be found working away at his day job as a SPMT Technician/Operator for a specialist heavy haulage company.

"I also manage to find some time to drive trucks for my old man when I'm home," he said.

But it's when he chucks his boots on and adorns the Gawler Show volunteer vest that Mr Turner feels the most connected to the local community.

"Since being elected in February it's been an exciting new venture," he said.

"Every year I look forward the most to the fireworks on Saturday night.

"No matter how long the week was setting up (believe me it's an insanely long week) it all comes together at 8:15 on Saturday night where we can all relax and wind down for a few hours before getting back into it at 5.30 Sunday morning," he said.

A lifetime at Gawler Show

At 84 years old, life member Dean Noll spent more than 40 years as a part of the Gawler Show committee's "big family".

Committed to being a part of the community and already a part of the Lions Club of Gawler, in 1981 Mr Noll began his time on the Gawler Show Committee.

"At that stage, I was just sort of perhaps looking for something to do around the town," he said.

"The show committee wrote a letter, if my memory serves me right, to the service clubs asking them if they would like to support the show by putting someone on the committee. "So I went to the AGM and got elected to the committee."

Throughout his time with Gawler Show, Mr Noll mostly volunteered in catering, with two terms as president.

"I went on the catering and trade space committee, where I spent nearly all my time on the show committee - other than the years I was president," he said.

With years of experience under his belt, Mr Noll was granted his life membership in 1994,

one of the highlights of his time with Gawler Show.

The Lions Club also spent most of Mr Noll's time manning the show gates to fundraise for the Lions Club.

"It was a good fundraiser for us [the Lions Club], those early years it was probably worth \$1000 but towards the end of it it was probably worth nearly \$3000," he said.

Mr Noll left the show committee in 2022, but still sometimes regrets leaving the "big family" he spent more than 40 years with.

"At times I regret that I did pull the pin on it," he said.

The life member now visits the show as an attendee, checking out the changes in his area of expertise.

"I always have a good look at the catering, and the trade space because that was what I was doing,"



he said.

"The show committee was almost like a bit of a family. We'd have a few social functions around the show ground or show time or after the show we'd go to the pub and have a meal, it was like a big family," he said.

Who is Hefty the Clown?

There is one burning question on the lips of showgoers across Gawler - who is Hefty the Clown of Destructive Entertainment?

The man himself, who is set to perform at 7pm on Saturday night, has described his act as "Evel Knievel meets Mr Bean".

While the appearance of Hefty remains a mystery to all, he has lifted the lid on what to expect during the show.

"High energy, loud excitement and a fast-paced show unlike anything South Australia has seen in years," he said.

"For young children sensitive to noise, we recommend bringing earmuffs for their comfort."

While his chaotic persona is his trademark,

headlined by his self-identified skills of "destroying things and causing mayhem", Hefty is driven by wholesome reasons at his core.

"[I enjoy] the smiles, joy, cheer and excitement from the crowd," he said.

"The louder the crowd roars, the faster we go - feeding off their energy every second. So, don't hold back!"

While the high stakes nature of his performance prevents him from practicing with any regularity, Hefty has plenty of experience under the bright lights - and now he's back.

"I'm returning with an even bigger and better show than ever before," he said.

He also had some advice for budding entertainers keen on exploring the clown industry.

"Firstly, you need to discover your own persona," he said.

"Then you would need to train and develop your look, learn core skills, something unique to yourself.

"Then you can start to practice, perform and promote yourself."

Check out Hefty at the Taylor and Forgie Arena at 7pm on Saturday before the fireworks show kicks off at 8.15pm.



Chebron Park Performance Team ready to vault into Gawler Show

The Chebron Park Performance Team will be bringing an equestrian flair to the Gawler Show, making the short trip over from Lyndoch.

Chebron Park Performance Team's Skye Barrowcliffe is at the head of the operation, which only got up and running earlier this year, and she is excited to show the community what they can do.

"As a new team, this is only our second public performance – but we're hitting the ground running," she said.

"Our debut was at the prestigious Adelaide Equestrian Festival in May, and the team delivered an unforgettable performance.

"We're thrilled to now be at the Gawler Show and look forward to many more opportunities to showcase our sport and inspire others to get involved."

The performance will feature "an exciting mix of individual and team vaulting routines", and Ms Barrowcliffe gave some further insight into exactly what equestrian vaulting entails.

"Equestrian vaulting is a unique sport that blends the beauty of dance and the athleticism of gymnastics – performed on a moving horse," she said.

"It originated centuries ago as a way to train Roman cavalry, but has since evolved into a dynamic and artistic discipline, particularly popular in Europe.

"Vaulting builds fitness, strength, coordination, and balance, while also fostering trust, teamwork, and lasting friendships.

"For many in the audience, this will be their first time seeing equestrian vaulting live – expect to be wowed by our athletes' grace, flexibility, strength, and a touch of fearless flair."

The team of nine vaulters range from 11 years old through to 43, with each bringing their own style and energy to the arena.

"Supporting them is our expert lunger Kirsty, who keeps the horses moving smoothly," Ms Barrowcliffe said.

"As well as Abby, our all-rounder who coaches, lunges, grooms, and ensures our equine athletes are in peak condition.

"We're beyond excited – performing in front of



a live audience is such a buzz, and the team can't wait to show off what they've been working on.

"Look out for our big smiles, high energy, and maybe even a cheeky wink if you're lucky – we love to connect with the crowd and share our passion."

So acknowledging their efforts, and seeing the excitement on people's faces as they walk through the gates, that is really the best part.



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Show-stopping section keeps on trucking

Undoubtedly one of the main attractions of any country show, if you're lucky enough to have it, is the famed Touch a Truck section.

This year, as has been the case in recent times, the Gawler Show is set to boast the ever-popular section once again.

For Touch a Truck convenor Jimmy Rundle, the two entities go hand in hand.

"I first became involved in the Gawler Show in 2018 helping my wife, Deanne with the miniature goat section," he said.

"My involvement has slowly grown over the years from helping with the set up and pack up of the show to helping with some grounds maintenance/ projects before joining committee two years ago.

"I'm a bit of a go anywhere help anyone type of person that's just my nature and last year I added the 'Touch a Truck' convenor to my portfolio."

A self-described "kid at heart" Mr Rundle believes that the energy and enthusiasm that never truly leaves you when you grow up is a big part behind Touch a Truck's

success.

"I think that's part of what makes this section so popular with kids and adults alike because we never really grow up our 'toys' just get bigger," he said.

"The Touch a Truck section isn't all about fun though there is some learning and education involved.

"It gives everyone an opportunity to get up and personal and learn how these trucks work and what it is the people who use them do to help us every day, from our first responders such as SAPOL, CFS, SES and Army defence force to organisations such as SA power networks."

On top of the highlights list for Jimmy last year was the 110-tonne crane from K3&Co Crane Hire in Roseworthy.

"I was like a kid in a candy store the day the crane rocked up and you could not wipe the smile from my face," he said.

"It was wonderful to see the public react just the same way across the weekend, the excitement in the kids and the adults was just great and



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made it all worthwhile.

"It was a massive effort just getting the crane to the showgrounds but the crew from K3&Co really went above and beyond and organised scaffolding so that the public could safely climb up into the cab of the crane and see what it's like to be a crane driver.

"We can't thank K3&Co crew enough for this, their community spirit really shone through. We are hoping to see them return as a feature again this year."

The final line-up of vehicles and showstoppers is, at time of writing, still to be finalised, but Jimmy is hopeful this year will be bigger and better than ever.

"I hope that not only will we see the return of our favourites from last year, I'm also hoping to get back to the show's agricultural roots with the addition of some farm machinery from Emmett's," he said.

"With the current drought I think it will be an important addition to help highlight the importance of our farmers and the

machines they use and what they do for our country.

"On a more fun note we will see the addition of a couple of sprint cars from Moore Racing, and a drag car and also the royal flying doctors simulator, another very important service for rural communities.

"The popular 'Buttrose landscaping' sandpit will also make a return."

While the trucks have undoubtedly stimulated Jimmy in recent times, his love for the show still stems from what it does for the community.

"I just love what the Gawler show does for bringing the community together," he said.

"It's the perfect balance of city meets country and its great watching it all come together."



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
